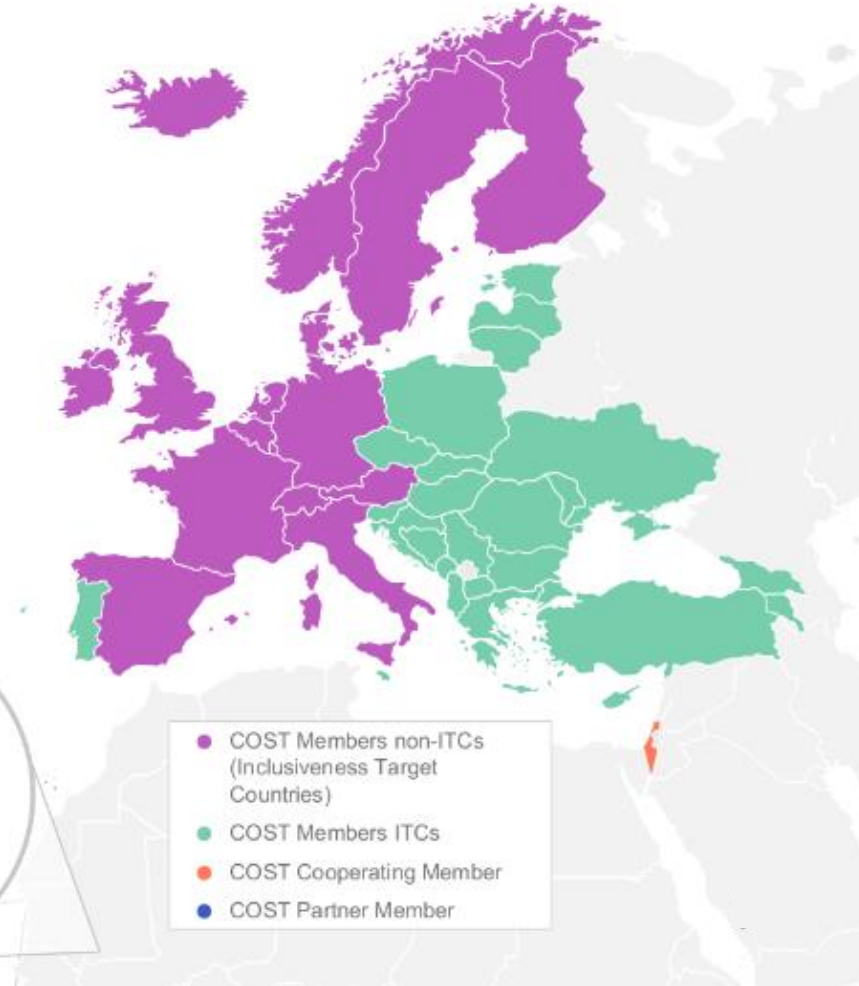

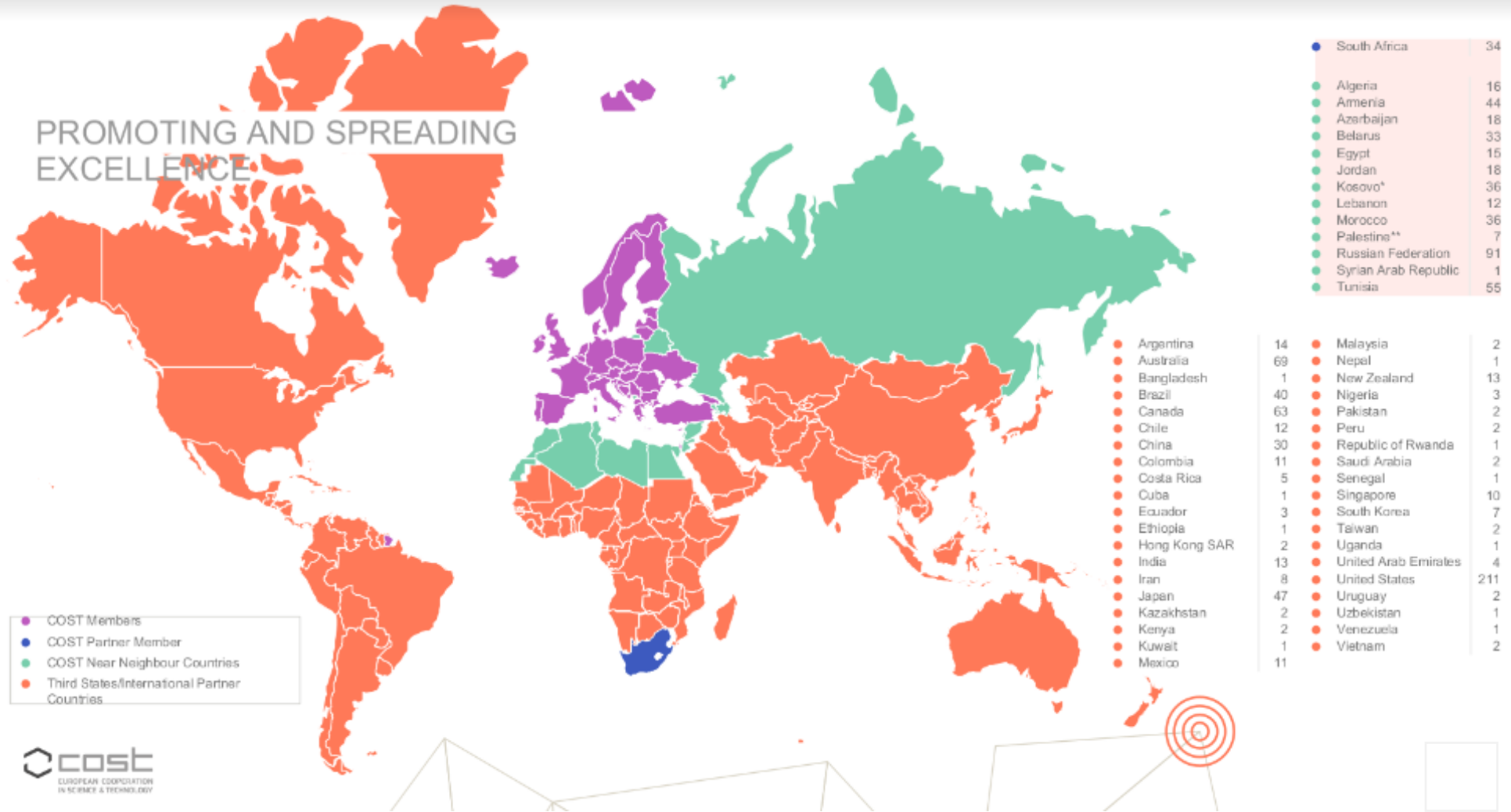

Follow-up funding


- Horizon 2020 reported success rate: 37% (on a yearly basis, around €390 million of approved common research projects spin off from ending Actions)
